Furthermore, classic decoration still embodies the luxury and status it represented in the past. Only now, thanks to **new technologies**, it is far more accessible for everybody.






II – The ABC of classic design


Architectural elements

Architectural elements such as cornice mouldings, wall panelling and frames, are the perfect tools to add different dimensions to your interior.



Architectural elements work well with the classical proportions and introduce proper sizing and dimension to a room. The mouldings in a room should appeal to our bodies.

When done right, you should be able to walk into a classical decorated room and "feel good" there.





II – The ABC of classic design

Selection of profiles

Start with the cornices. After selecting this ceiling decoration, we recommend you to continue with the skirting boards and eventually choose the wall panels. You can already start thinking about colours, but this comes second to the selection of your profiles.

III - Get started

Wallscaping

Wall panelling brings symmetry and order to your room, while at the same time adding character. Just as no two homes – or homeowners – are alike, there are no hard and fast rules for wallscaping. But to start you off, we present some guidelines:

- 1. It's all about symmetry. Include this in your design for a calm and balanced room.
- 2. Start with existing lines in your interior, such as doors, a fireplace or existing mouldings.
- 3. Calculate the ideal height of your panelling according to your wall. Panelling is classically placed up to a third of the total wall height, but feel free to go higher or lower if this pleases you more!





Raised skirting board

Looking for an elegant and luxurious effect that remains affordable? A visibly higher skirting board is what you're looking for!

Place a wall moulding at a fifth of the total wall height (<55 cm). Then paint skirting board, wall moulding and the wall in between in the same colour.

Up for more? Opt for a matching door frame.



When starting with traditional panelling, you first want to decide on the height. Place a chair in front of your wall: usually the back of the chair corresponds to a third of the total wall height (80-90 cm). Place your wall moulding here. Also: a little too low is better than too high.

Combine with wallpaper and possibly a composite cornice moulding for an even more ornate effect.




III – Get started

Prestigious high wall moulding

High wall mouldings and panelling are perfect for transforming a boring wall. A repeating pattern immediately makes an unassuming wall look more interesting and put-together. Integrate smart LED lighting for an instant wow effect.

Where to begin? Start by placing a wall moulding at **two thirds** of the wall height. In most houses, this corresponds to approximately 160 to 180cm in height. To determine the height of your skirting, keep in mind that the skirting board is traditionally higher than the distance between the other panels used on the wall.

Grandiose walls

Up for something even more impressive? Why not cover the entire wall with panelling? **High wall mouldings** are usually positioned 30 to 50 centimetres below the ceiling. The higher the room, the greater this distance gets.

Don't be put off by **large cornice mouldings**, once installed the cornice mouldings will look a lot smaller. At the same time, the room will seem more spacious.

Smart use of LED lighting




